1 Cor. 7:36

But if any man thinks that he is acting unbecomingly toward <u>his virgin daughter</u>, <u>if she is past her youth</u>, and if it must be so, let him do what he wishes, he does not sin; <u>let her marry</u>. (NASB)

If anyone is worried that he might not be acting honorably toward <u>the virgin he is engaged to</u>, and <u>if his passions are too strong</u> and he feels he ought to marry, he should do as he wants. He is not sinning. <u>They should get married</u>. (NIV)

1 Cor. 7:36

If anyone thinks that he is not behaving properly toward his <u>betrothed</u>, <u>if his passions are strong</u>, and it has to be, let him do as he wishes: <u>let them marry</u>—it is no sin. (ESV)

But if a man has <u>a partner in celibacy</u> and feels that he is not behaving properly towards her, if, that is, <u>his instincts are too strong for him</u>, and something must be done, he may do as he pleases; there is nothing wrong in it; <u>let them marry</u>. (NEB)
