- 5. Does God take joy in judgment?

- 1. What is the offer for Moab according to verses 4b-5?
- 2. Compare four types of rule in verse 5 with four descriptions of Moab in verse 6. Why do you suppose Moab rejected the offer of refuge given by the prophecy?
- 3. Read Isaiah 11:10. What is significant about this verse and the offer given Moab?
- 4. What is the main problem with Moab? It's not just a problem of the powerful?
- 5. Look at 16:12. What good will it do Moab to pray to their god (Chemosh)? What does this tell Judah?
