The problem: how can we be consistent with what we believe?

None of the philosophers were or are consistent:
Rousseau, Schopenhauer,
Marx, Heidegger...
.... only Don Quixote was.....



How can we be consistent as Christians?

1. What's the mind?

- Mind is closely related to person. In the same way we consider what a person is, we will see the mind.
- Are persons just random, a collection of chemical substances? Or more?
- In The Concept of Mind (1949), Gilbert Ryle rejected the mind-body dualism that sees man as a small machine with the mind as « ghost » governing it. The workings of the mind are not distinct from the actions of the body
- The Bible has a concrete way of describing human persons as entities with the calling and ability to react to things in the created world

2. What's the mind? God's mind

- 1. The mind of God = his changelessness. God's thoughts belong to his person
- 2. God's mind is God planning/ thinking/ acting/ communicating (not an independent faculty >> God's simplicity)
- 3. God is rational, logical, all-wise and consistent. God's nature is expressed as he acts in line with his own laws of logic. His truth is always true
- 4. Creation and providence come from the mind of God on the basis of divine rationality and so are structured with intelligence and finality

3. What's the mind? Our mind

- 1. Man is the image of God = a rational being
- 2. « Mind events » and « brain events » man a psychosomatic unity
- 3. There can be a harmony between divine and human rationality = lining up with God
- 4. DNA information coded in living cells
- 5. God controls our nature and destiny through control of our genetic make-up. God must be able to control the thought process even of those who are opposed to him! 1 Cor 12.18, 15.35-41
- 6. Sin has noetic consequences on the contents of our minds, choices, desires, memory, feeling, affections.
- 7. There can be mind changes. The power that directs us.

4. What's the mind? Some common assumptions (media lies 1-4)

- 1. The sociology of knowledge we are bound to think according to our environment
- 2. The confusion of technological progress and human progress. Things are getting better and better
- 3. We are basically OK human pride
- 4. Human nature is normal

But a Christian point of view is that the content of our mind is either abnormal or normal

A vital point in Romans...

Romans 12. 1
Jewish language for the Jews
Verse 2
Greek ideas for the Pagans

Together they are to be united in one sort of thinking, action and worship

The way to a living and growing church, one that is different to the surrounding culture

This is not just about individuals but about the Church community

Being transformed to a new world Yesterday, today, tomorrow

Before becoming a believer?

- Me was everything, God nothing
- You didn't even know it (1 Corinthians 2.14)

After becoming a believer?

- God became EVERYTHING
- You want above all to please him

One day, in the future

- You will be entirely HIS, like Jesus and with HIM

What's the change?

God works change in every Christian:

A renewing on the inside which is invisible but real

Now:

- « He who began a good work in you will complete it to the day of Christ » (Phil 1.7)
- « God works in us the will to do » (Phil 2.13)

How?

God changed what I was...

And he is progressively changing me...

Only one reply to the How? question in the Bible:

- By the Holy Spirit
 - By his Word

« You have been regenerated by an incorruptible seed, by the Word of God » (1 Pet 1. 21)

If so, Why

are so many Christians seemingly not growing in grace...?

- They limit faith to feelings and shun teaching (so did the Corinthians)
- They are not renewed in their intelligence by biblical truth
- Too many dichotomise faith and the rest of life
- But experiences and feelings do not change lives (Media lie no. 5)

John Stott, Your Mind Matters...

Perhaps the current mood of anti-intellectualism now begins to be seen as the serious evil it is. It is not true piety at all but part of the fashion of the world and therefore a form of worldliness. To denigrate the mind is to undermine foundational Christian doctrines.

Has God created us rational beings, and shall we deny our humanity which he has given us? Has God spoken to us and shall we not listen to his words? Has God renewed our mind through Christ, and shall we not think with it? Is God going to judge us by his Word, and shall we not be wise and build our house upon this rock? (Page 26)

Thoughts

Primacy of the intelligence?

- Many theologians say our feelings are the main motors and humans act out of passion (Pascal/Dabney)
- This is not in opposition to the Reformers' idea of the primacy of the intellect, that the mind evaluates and judges everything
- The mind allows us to understand what we feel, where we're headed, what our bodies tell us
- Without a spirit of understanding, we can't interpret our feelings, either joy or sadness

Heart, mind, will, feelings

The heart is the unity between the mind and the body with its feelings and will - Luke 6.45

The heart is IN the mind, the will and the feelings

The heart gives us direction

A transformed mind comes from a regenerate heart

A renewed mind directs the will and speaks to the feelings

A change of heart

When God changes HEARTS he changes people

The heart acts on the MIND

The mind expresses new WILL to please God

« O God create in me a pure HEART, renew in me a good SPIRIT... Give me the JOY of your salvation and may a good WILL uphold me » (Ps 51.12-14)

The main work of God's Word...

God's Spirit does not produce nice feelings in us BUT

The Spirit speaks to our spirit to renew our mind,

Because our heart has been changed

An illustration...

« Don't you know that...? »

In 1 Corinthians 6 (2, 3, 9, 15, 16, 19)
Paul uses « Don't you know that...? »
6 times

Not « don't you feel that ? »!

« Don't you know that sinners don't get into God's kingdom? »... Don't get it wrong...

You were like them... But you have been washed and justified by the blood of Christ » (9-11)

John Stott, Your Mind Matters...

the fact that man's mind is fallen is no excuse for a retreat from thought to emotion, for the emotional of man's nature is equally fallen. Indeed, sin has more dangerous effects on our faculty of feeling than our faculty of thinking, because our opinions are more easily checked and regulated by revealed truth than our experiences. (Page 16)

WHY?

BECAUSE OUR FEELINGS ESCAPE EASILY FROM REALITY, MORE EASILY THAN OUR INTELLIGENCE...

AND THEN WE LIVE IN A DREAM WORLD (aided and abetted by selfie fantasies)

BEING CONVINCED...

When the heart is changed, it's a question not only of knowledge, but of convictions

Our convictions make us act differently:

We believe and so we speak, KNOWING THAT He who raised Jesus will raise us with Jesus KNOWING the fear of the Lord, we seek to CONVINCE men... because the love of Christ has CONVINCED US THAT one died for all »

(2 Cor 4. 13,14; 5.11, 14)

Where do you get « conviction »?

BY HOLDING ON TO WHAT BELONGS TO CHRIST...

- Nobody knows the salvation by being half convinced. You have to give yourself. There is something mysterious about it. The Holy Spirit makes the truth come true for us
- Calvin's « two graces » come from « possessing Christ »
 - « He will lead you into all truth... He will take what is mine and give it to you » (Jn 16. 13-15).

Two exhortations to change our minds

2 Corinthians 10.3-5

« take every thought captive to obey Christ »

Colossians 2.8

« See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit... and not according to Christ... »

Having a mind like Christ...

When Christians fill their minds with Christ they will start to become like him Jesus shows us what true humanness is:

- o Confidence, love and hope in God
- o Perfect obedience and joyful service
- o True love and compassion for the suffering
- o The courage to give oneself
- o A projet for life
- o Balance between liberty and responsablity
- o Sanctified feelings, including anger...

A Christian world view criticises everything from top down, in a biblical perspective



- Jesus is Lord over all, above everything
- Our mind looks at everything from his perspective
- Everything is different from when we were down in the street

How does being critical work?

- Not being critical of people in judging them. That is God's job
- The difference between judgment and discernment
- Taking distance from the life-style of the talking animals - pleasure and leisure
- Taking distance from the ideologies that control them (Marx, Darwin and Freud or « feel good » celebrity ideology)
- Making world-views as an alternative to theirs with Christian values

BUT WHAT ARE CHRISTIAN VALUES? a renewed intelligence is a mind directed by God and informed by his Word

Motivations: is your aim to please the Lord?

A change of life will only come progressively from a renewed mind

Orientation: do you want to know the Lord?

In stead of pushing him off, he is your principal concern

Perspective: does God decide or you?

What God approves, you do; what he loves you love; what is against his truth is your mortal enemy

Steet-wise: get a spirit of discernment!

The opposite of error is truth. What is Christian lines up with God's truth and his right and wrong

Ready for a fight?



The Christian life is a fight to the death with our sin, the world and the devil (Col 3. 5, 12)

(and sometimes with other Christians)
