JUDGE NOT!

Matthew 7:1-5

Four ways of reacting to Jesus' teaching of chapters 5 & 6:

I. Feel superior by knowing the Law: judge everyone

This is "outside-in" righteousness: feeling righteous by comparison with others. Criticize to feel better about yourself: "at least I'm not/ I don't..."

A. How?

- 1. Act as judge (v1-2): I am more obedient or spiritual than you
- 2. Act as hypocrite (v3-5): I focus on your sins and ignore my own (as if I don't have any)

B. Why?

- The judge incurs a stricter standard of judgment on himself/herself (v2)
 - From others
 - From God
- 2. The hypocrite is blind to his/her sins by focusing only on others. Becomes totally out of touch with his/her heart (v3-5)

- C. Solution?
 - 1. Recognize the true Judge: James 4:11-12 Romans 2:1-4 → 3:21-28

Receive forgiveness by **grace** → humble → gracious to others (Matt 5:7; 6:12)

- 2. See the log in your eye! Become more aware of your heart and repent. Then gentled and able gently to correct another. (7:5)
