1. In John 3:36, John the Baptist was clear with his message that one must believe in Jesus or else face the wrath of God. This kind of clarity was not unusual for John. See Luke 3:15-17. What is his point in this message?	D. Eph. 1:11 4. Read Rom. 8:27-28. How can you as a Christian be comforted by the sovereignty of God?
