

Acts 6: 1 - 7


Now in these days when the disciples were increasing in number, a complaint by the Hellenists arose against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. ² And the twelve summoned the full number of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables. ³ Therefore, brothers, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we will appoint to this duty. ⁴ But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." ⁵ And what they said pleased the whole gathering, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. ⁶ These they set before the apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands on them.



Social Distancing Practices for FCCW Worship Services

First, **trust in the Lord** and not our procedures. Then practice these protocols faithfully as a way of loving one another. Christ is in control AND He normally works through His people to accomplish what He is doing. (Jeremiah 9:23-24; Second Corinthians 1:8-11; Hebrews 2:9-18; 10:23-25)

Second, if you are sick, PLEASE STAY HOME. If you are not sure, stay home and make use of the live-stream. No one with an elevated temperature should come for any reason.

Third, we encourage those with health risks, co-mortality factors, and household contact with those who have such risk factors to STAY HOME and make use of the live-streaming for a little longer. As those without these issues return to more gatherings, even with social distancing protocols, there will be more virus transmission. So please wait and allow the rest of the population to build the necessary herd-immunity for you to be able to participate more safely later.

Fourth, *if and only if* you do <u>not</u> have higher risk of serious COVID complications and do <u>not</u> live with anyone who does, then please come participate in the worship services following these precautions:

- Please wear a facemask (no one will be permitted entrance without one).
- Please come in with your household members and sit together.
- Please maintain a distance of six (6) feet from anyone not in your household.
- Please keep an empty pew between your household and anyone else.
- Please refrain from shaking hands or any other physical contact with anyone not in your own household.
- Please thoroughly wash your hands before and after the worship service.
- Please only one person in the bathroom (or parent and child) at a time.

Fifth, please know we are doing the following to help protect you and our neighbors:

- Disinfecting all public surfaces, doorknobs, etc. before and after every service.
- Praying for the congregation and all our neighbors.
- Continuing to provide live-streaming for those unable to join physically yet.
- Removed hymnals and Bibles from the pews, providing Orders of Worship with printed hymns. You may want to bring your own Bible.
- Rope off every other pew to help maintain adequate distance between households.

Sixth, in order to minimize potentially lethal virus transmission

- We will use individual cups and wafers for communion on the first Sunday back.
- No passing offering plate—please place offering in box in the back.
- No-Contact Greeters will assist with social distancing protocols outside of entrances.
- Hand-sanitizer stations at entrances.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

What blind spots do you have? As a Christian, what things about serving Christ and one another are especially difficult? Are there ways we are called to serve that you may not even recognize? How would you know? How can others within the Body of Christ help us? God has provided us deacons in part to help us in serving one another faithfully.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Acts 6:1-7; James 1:26-27; First Timothy 3:8-13. DISCUSS, What is Jesus preparing the Church to do? What are some of the growing pains they are experiencing? What are the ramifications of Christ's kingdom being global? How are you (we) serving in that mission? PRAY for God to enable us to serve Him and one another well. Ask God to give our deacons and elders wisdom and strength.

Sunday Evening

In lieu of the evening worship service tonight, please set apart some time to pray for God to bring repentance and renewal to us at FCCW and throughout His Church.

Monday

READ Acts 6:1-7; First Timothy 3:8-13. DISCUSS, These are strange qualifications for waiters. What is going on? How does our role as peace-makers help to explain this role for deacons? PRAY, "Lord Jesus, thank You for enabling us to serve You and one another. Teach us to do so with grace and wisdom."

Tuesday

READ Acts 6:1-7; Numbers 27:15-23. DISCUSS, How is the continuation of service from Moses to Joshua similar and different from the same from Jesus to His deacons? How are we all called to serve one another? PRAY, "Jesus, You are the King of All, the promised Messiah, Savior of the World. Enable us to serve You as we should and to give You faithful service as our Lord."

Wednesday

READ Acts 6:1-7; Ephesians 4:11-16; First Timothy 3:1-13. DISCUSS, How are we to work together in the Church as the Body of Christ? For what are elders and deacons responsible? For what are we all responsible? Thank the Lord for including us in His work. PRAY, "Lord, You have promised to build Your Church. Help us to trust You in speaking the truth in love."

Thursday

READ **Acts 6:1-7**; **1Peter 4:8-11**. DISCUSS, How are we supposed to serve? Who? Why? Why would co-heirs with the King of Kings need to serve anyone? What did our Lord do? PRAY, "Lord, teach us to trust You and to see Your wisdom as so much greater than our own."

Friday

READ Acts 6:1-7; James 1:26-27; First Timothy 3:8-13. How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if Christ has counted you as part of His own! PRAY for renewal in the Church and revival in our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the gathered worship service tomorrow.

READ Acts 6:1-15; 1Tim 3:8-13. Invite others to watch the *live-stream* service with you tomorrow. Pray for Christ to grant us boldness in following Him.

Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. ¹³ For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.
