- When books were proven to be authored by Apostles, then they were given canonicity.
- Mark, Luke, Acts were generally accepted because of the Apostles testimony.
- When the church studied the books to see if God was the author, these books were considered self-attesting.

- Irenaeus (follower of Polycarp)

 - -Quotes from all but about 5 NT books





Council of Jamnia AD 90-100

- No records of what occurred.
- Not to decide what should be included.
- To discuss those already included.



Muratorian Canon AD 150 First list of books in the NT received by the church Did not include 1 and 2 Peter, James, and Hebrews The church only ever used 4 gospels No more than a dozen or so other "gospels" exist By AD 180, 22 of 27 NT books were universally accepted James, Jude, 2 & 3 John, 2 Peter, Hebrews, and Revelation

- Only a few churches had struggles with these.
