The Belt of Truth

- Truth defends against deception.
- > Truth is an integrating force for the believer.
- > Truth is the foundation for discernment.

The Breastplate of Righteousness

- Righteousness defends against accusations.
- Righteousness means "to be right with God."
- Righteousness involves faith & love (1 Thess. 5:8)
- Righteousness is our sanctification.

The Boot of the Gospel

- The gospel of peace
- The gospel: offensive or defensive?



a study in Ephesians

The Shield of Faith

- Faith defends against doubt & unbelief.
- > 1 Jn. 5:4 "victory that overcometh the world"
- > Faith: salvation or daily living? (Mk 4:40; Rom.

1:17; 5:2; 1 Thess. 3:5)



a study in Ephesians

The Helmet of Salvation

- > The helmet is our blessed hope.
- > A helmet protects the mind.
- ➤ 1 Thess. 4:18: the power of hope



a study in Ephesians

The Sword of Scripture

- ➤ The necessary role of the Holy Spirit
- ➤ Heb. 4:12 (*logos*, but *rhema* here)
- > Jesus demonstrated use of this armor.



a study in Ephasians

Take Aways from today's lesson

- Satan targets our weak points.
- > We must be vigilant as a soldier.
- > There is no accommodation for retreat.
- > With this armor we can *stand* and *withstand*.
- The armor in a single statement: "The way to spiritual power is to be filled with the Spirit." (Ryrie, commenting on this passage)
