# The Name of Jesus—LORD!

1. Jesus Died as a Servant to Be Exalted as the LORD with U	Ūs.

2. The Father Raised Jesus from Death and Humiliation to Glory.

3. The Song to Christ Praises Him for Selfless Service in Redemption.

CONCLUSION: In this conclusion to the *Carmen Christi* (Hymn to Christ) we learn that the glorious height to which Jesus was raised was not just a position of honor, but *the* position of all honor, glory, and praise. He returns to the glory He shared with the Father from before all time. Jesus Christ is the Lord! As such our position *in Him* is exalted beyond all imagining. We are partners together in the gospel not only with one another, but with God Himself.

#### Isaiah 45:21-24

Declare and present your case; let them take counsel together! Who told this long ago? Who declared it of old? Was it not I, the Lord? And there is no other god besides me, a righteous God and a Savior; there is none besides me.

"Turn to me and be saved, all the ends of the earth!

For *I am God*, and there is no other.

By myself I have sworn; from my mouth has gone out in righteousness a word that shall not return:

'To me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear allegiance.'

"Only in the Lord, it shall be said of me, are righteousness and strength; to him shall come and be ashamed all who were incensed against him.

#### First Chronicles 13:5-8

So David assembled all Israel from the Nile of Egypt to Lebo-hamath, to bring *the ark of God* from Kiriath-jearim. And David and all Israel went up to Baalah, that is, to Kiriath-jearim that belongs to Judah, to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by *the name of the Lord* who sits enthroned above the cherubim. And they carried the ark of God on a new cart, from the house of Abinadab, and Uzzah and Ahio were driving the cart. And David and all Israel were celebrating before God with all their might, with song and lyres and harps and tambourines and cymbals and trumpets.

### Nehemiah 9:5b-8

"...Stand up and bless the Lord your God from everlasting to everlasting. Blessed be your glorious name, which is exalted above all blessing and praise. You are the Lord, you alone. You have made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them; and you preserve all of them; and the host of heaven worships you. You are the Lord, the God who chose Abram and brought him out of Ur of the Chaldeans and gave him the name Abraham. You found his heart faithful before you, and made with him the covenant to give to his offspring the land of the Canaanite .... And you have kept your promise, for you are righteous."

# **Ephesians 1:15-23**

For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of His great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

## **Sunday Morning**

READ Philippians 2:9-11; Isaiah 45:21-24; First Chronicles 13:5-8; Nehemiah 9:5b-8; Psalm 138:1-8; 148:1-14; Ephesians 1:15-23. DISCUSS What difference does it make that Jesus is the God of the Scripture? How has the Father exalted Him? What is the significance of His name—the Lord? PRAY "Jesus, help us to understand Your full identity as God Himself."

## **Sunday Evening**

### Monday

READ Philippians 2:5-11; Isaiah 45:21-24; Psalm 138:1-8; John 3:16. DISCUSS How does the context of this passage in Isaiah help us understand Philippians? Who is this Lord? What has He promised? What has He done? SERVE by caring for someone in Christ's name! MEDITATE on Psalm 8:1-9. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for serving us sacrificially. Help us serve others with the same joyful exuberance."

## **Tuesday**

READ Philippians 2:9-11; First Chronicles 13:5-8; Psalm 148:1-14; Galatians 2:20. DISCUSS Why were they bringing the ark of God to Jerusalem? How was it called? What does it mean for God to set His name on them? Why does that matter? MEDITATE on Psalm 8:1-9. PRAY, "Lord, give us delight in You like no other."

### Wednesday

READ Philippians 2:5-11; Nehemiah 9:5b-8; Psalm 138:1-8; First John 4:10. DISCUSS What has the Lord done? What does He deserve? SERVE Feed, clothe, or care for someone today in Christ's name. MEDITATE on Psalm 8:1-9. PRAY, "Lord, enable us to love others as You love us. Please teach us humility so that we might serve with joy."

## **Thursday**

READ Philippians 2:9-11; Ephesians 1:15-23; Psalm 148:1-14; Mark 15:34. DISCUSS Where has the Father seated the Son? Why? What does that have to do with us? SERVE Listen patiently to someone who may be frightened. MEDITATE on Psalm 8:1-9. PRAY, "Lord, we long to love in the power of the resurrection. Help us to put sin to death and to live in resurrection life."

### **Friday**

READ Philippians 2:5-11; Isaiah 45:21-24; First Chronicles 13:5-8; Nehemiah 9:5b-8; Psalm 138:1-8; 148:1-14; Ephesians 1:15-23. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? DELIGHT in Christ, knowing that we will be like Him one day! MEDITATE on Psalm 8:1-9. PRAY for unity and joyful care for one another at FCCW.

## Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow which is *available both in-person and via live-stream*. READ **Philippians 2:1-11**; **Romans 8:12-17**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the service. Ask Jesus to gather us together joyfully to praise Him.
