## **The primary motivation of the Christian**. {**2 Corinthians 5:14**} "The Love of Christ

controls me"

The Christian is motivated from inside out: {key thought here is Christ changed our thinking}

- Vs. 20 "But that is not the way you learned Christ" Greek: emathet
- Vs. 21a "assuming that you have heard him" Greek: *ekousate*
- Vs. 21b "and were <u>taught in him</u>" Greek: *edidachthete*

<u>"Putting off & Putting on</u>" {Key thought is the action is not completed in the negative but only when accompanied by the positive}

**Eph 4:23** "to be renewed in the spirit of your minds" {Key Thought is that the Spirit of God now *controls* our thinking}

- <u>Romans 8:6&7</u>
- Our thinking will result in our conduct

## **Christian Behavior is a result of Christian thinking**

- The resulting conduct will lead to the building up of the body of Christ. Note that Paul is speaking in terms of the church not as individuals.
- Note how radical the change is below, not just we no longer do X but we now do Y
- See that the new mind focus will bear fruit

<u>Eph 4:25</u>	"lay aside falsehood"	"speak truth"	Unity of the body
<u>Eph 4:26</u>	"Be angry"	"do not sin"	Devil won't split the body
Eph 4:28	"steal no longer"	"let him labor"	sharing with needy in the body
Eph 4:29	"no unwholesome word"	"edifying word"	giving grace to those who hear in the body
Eph 4:31&32	"bitterness, wrath, etc"	"kind, tender-hearted	Building up of the body in Love
