THE SUFFERING SERVANT PREDICTED AND REJECTED (PART II) Isaiah 52:13-53:12

The predictions were:

- 1. The Messiah would be a **shocking** servant
 - (52:13-15).
 - a. Jesus' **exaltation** was astonishing (v.13).
 - b. Jesus' *humiliation* was astonishing (v.14).
 - c. Jesus' **proclamation** was astonishing (v.15).
- 2. The Messiah would be a suffering servant (53:1-
 - 3).
 - a. He had *humble* beginnings (v.2).
 - b. He had no **<u>outstanding features</u>**, even as a man (v.2).
 - c. He was despised and rejected, even by
 His own (v.3).

- 3. The Messiah would be a substituted/<u>sacrificial</u> servant (53:4-6). What is the "we" all about?
- 4. The Messiah would be a *silent* servant (53:7-9).
- 5. The Messiah would be a **<u>satisfying</u>** servant (53:10-12).
 - a. Jesus' death satisfied the <u>heart of God</u> (Jn. 8:29).
 - b. Jesus' death satisfied the <u>demands</u> of the law (Rom. 3:23-26; 1 Jn. 2:2).
 - Isaiah 53 predicted events <u>700</u> years in advance.
 - Isaiah predicted events <u>2700+</u> years in advance.
 - (Zechariah 12:10-14; Rev. 1:7)
