| a. a guilt producing warning device given to all   |

| a. The change made in a believer   |
| i. what they know  |
| -having been born again - 1 Pet 1:23   |

| B. Gratitude - vs 19-20  |
| 1. And by this we know that we are of the truth, and shall assure our hearts before Him.                                   |
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| a. <i>ginosko</i> - allow, be aware (of), feel, (have) know(-ledge), perceived, be resolved, can speak be sure, understand |
| resolved, can speak, be sure, understand.  |
| i. use of future tense showing that they would understand,   |
| ii. this knowledge was not intuitive   |
| b. by this refers back to vs 18 - brotherly love   |
| c. of the truth  |
| i. lit - out of the truth we exist   |
| ii. Only true believers possess the sacrificial love described in vs 14-18 to  |
| live as described in vs 4-12   |
| iii. Truth as found in Scripture - Ps 119:160; Jo 17:17  |
| d. and shall assure our hearts before Him  |
| i. Assurance of salvation comes as we see the serving love for fellow  |
| believers exhibited in our lives   |
| ii. <i>peitho</i> - to <b>pacify</b> or <b>conciliate</b> (by other fair means); to assent (to                             |
| evidence or authority), to rely (by inward certainty):agree, assure,   |
| believe, have confidence, make friend, obey, persuade, trust, yield.   |
| - future active ind.—will assure   |
| pacify to quell the anger: conciliate to stop from being angry   |

- 2. For if our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and knows all things.
  - a. For if our heart condemns us the conscience is not always accurate 1Co 4:4
    - b. God is greater than our heart, and knows all things.
      - i. He has declared us righteous Ro 8:1
      - ii. Nothing can separate us from the love of God Ro 8:31-39
- B. Boldness vs 21-22a
  - 1. Doubt ceases when believers walk faithfully
    - a. if our heart does not condemn us Heb 10:22
    - b. we have confidence toward God. Job 22:23, 26;
      - i. walking in truth 1Jo 2:28;
      - ii. Walking in love 1 Jo 4:17
      - iii. parrhesia all out-spokenness, frankness, bluntness, publicity;
      - assurance:--bold (-ly, -ness, -ness of speech), confidence, plainly(-ness).
  - 2. Confidence frees faith
    - a. And whatever we ask
      - i. Hebrews uses *parrhesia* in 4:16 Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

ii. 1Jo 5:14 Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

- b. we receive from Him, Jo 14:13-14; 15:7,16; 16:23-24
- C. Submission vs 22b
  - 1. because we keep His commandments
    - a. we keep not from compulsion, but b/c of changed character vs 1-10
    - b. commandments refers back to loving the brethren vs 13-18
  - 2. and do those things that are pleasing in His sight. Heb 13:20-21
    - a. eliminates the idea of merit

b. an obedience deriving from a shared life of Christ Who always did that which pleased the Father

- D. Faith  $vs^2 23$ 
  - 1. And this is His commandment:
    - a. saving faith has 3 essential parts Faith, Hope, and Love
    - b. faith is a God given gift that endures
    - c. faith also responds to His commandment in obedience
  - 2. that we should believe on the name of His Son Jesus Christ

a. believe is in the aorist form indicating an action that happened in the past with continuing results

- b. the object of that faith is the name of His Son Jesus Christ
- 3. and love one another, as He gave us commandment.
  - a. Love is in the Pres active; Indicating a continuous action in the time called now
  - b. not based on feelings but an act of the will based on a new character
- E. Appreciation for the Indwelling Holy Spirit vs 24
  - 1. Now he who keeps His commandments abides in Him, and He in him.
    - a. one of John's favorite words abides *meno* the definition of keeping His commandments
    - b. proof of salvation and He in him.
  - 2. And by this we know that He abides in us, by the Spirit whom He has given us.
    - a. the shared life of Christ is only possible "by the Spirit" Ro 8:2; 2 Co 3:6
    - b. by this we know that He abides in us b/c of the effects of the Spirit Jo 3:8
  - 3. Salvation is not a one time event, it is a way of life
