"Believing Wife, Unbelieving Husband"

A. Living with an non-abusive, non-Christian husband!

- **General Observations**
 - Christ elevates women to be spiritual equals with men. Galatians 3:26-28
 - Specifics left between husband and wife to work out.
- Specific Responsibilities
 - To stay with her unbelieving husband—1 Corinthians 7
 - To submit to her unbelieving husband
 - Effective evangelistic tool—life-style evangelism
 - Ways to enhance ones' testimony for Christ
 - Concentrate on your behavior. 3:1-2
 - (1) "Won without a word"
 - (2) No guarantee—1 Corinthians 7:16
 - Keep Physical Appearance in perspective—3:3
 - (1) Proper worship apparel—1 Timothy 2:9-10
 - (2) Practical level—not to attract men
 - Develop the "inner self", the real "you" 3:4
 - (1) Two Specific Qualities

 - (a) "gentle"—"mild, meek"(b) "quiet"—"tranquility from within"
 - (2) Importance—"precious to God" Focus Your Attention on Your husband—3:5-6

B. Staying with an abusive, non-Christian Husband?

- Is staying in an abusive marriage an appropriate application?
- Abuse is not about submission, but about power
- Counsel for the Abused
 - Wife not responsible for the husband's behavior.
 - Submission has God-imposed limitations
 - Physical separation may be necessary—1 Corinthians 7:5
