## The Body of Christ, Spiritual Gifts, and Spiritual Maturity, Part 4 "The Church as the Body of Christ" 1 Corinthians 12:12-13

The Apostle introduces a metaphor according to which we are to understand the nature of the Church.

## 1. The Nature of the Church Described

# v. 12 "For as the body is one and has many members,

v. 13

(1) A Living Organism with Many Members but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ."

- A body is *one body*, though it has many members. This is God's design.

- The members of a body cannot exist apart from the body!

- They have no purpose apart from the body of which they are members!

#### (2) All the Members of the Body – though Many – are One Body!

- The members of the human body are many and diverse, but still have a God-designed unity!

(3) So also is Christ! We are His body!

### 2. The Formation of the Church Described

(1) All believers are baptized into one body "For by (in) one Spirit we were all baptized into one body - whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves of free – and have all been made to drink into one Spirit."

#### Spirit baptism:

-1- What does it mean, to be baptized in the Spirit?

We have been united to Christ; joined to Him; made partakers of the Spirit of Christ.

-2- Who are those who have been baptized in the Spirit?

All believers share in the gift of the Spirit (Rom. 8:9). They do so from the time of their incorporation into the body of Christ.

#### -3- When did this happen?

At our conversion. When we were united to Christ we were given the Holy Spirit.

#### -4- Who brought this about? Who baptized us in the Spirit? Jesus Christ

- (2) All believers are baptized in the Spirit, whatever their background or social status! "whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves of free"
  - -1- The "middle wall" between Jew and Gentile had been removed!
    - Native Jews had no superior spiritual standing in the church
  - -2- All were made "free men" in Christ!
- (3) All believers have been made to drink of one Spirit "and have all been made to drink into one Spirit." - Parallel here to the baptism in the Spirit
  - This took place at the time of regeneration

- Jesus caused us to drink of the Holy Spirit "made to drink" - Note the passive voice;

- Cf. John 7:37-39 How does one drink? By believing in Jesus!
