Isolating through:

- A. Dealings "Come on, let us deal wisely with them"
- **B.** Desire "lest they multiply"
- C. Distrust "they join our enemies, and fight against us"
- III. Adversity -"they made their lives bitter" (vs. 11-16)

*Instigating:* 

- A. Humiliation "taskmasters to afflict them"
- **B.** Harshness "made... Israel to serve with rigour"
- C. Homicide -"if it be a son, then ye shall kill him"
