God Raises Up a Deliverer for His People
Exodus 2 - Part 3

I. A Deliverer Provided: From Pauper to Prince. vv.1-10

(The first forty years – Acts 7:22)

- a. The birth of Moses. vv.1,2 cf. 6:20; 7:7; Nu.26:59
- b. The preservation of Moses. vv.3-9 cf. Gen.6:14
- c. The adoption and naming of Moses. v.10
Note the irony of this scene – cf. Acts 7:22
- d. The story of Moses is the story of Exodus. (Dr. C. Jero)
 - 1. Pharaoh's daughter hears Moses' cries and has compassion. cf. 3:12 Ex.1-2
 - 2. She sends someone to draw him out. Ex.3-15 (Moshe = *One who draws out*)
 - 3. She provides someone to nourish him. Ex 16-24 Cf. Nu.11:12
 - 4. She afterward adopts him as a son in her house. Ex 25-40

God saves Israel from bondage → and gives them His Law → that He may dwell with them

II. A Deliverer Prepared: From Prince to Shepherd. vv.11-22

(The second forty years – Acts 7:30)

- a. Moses has a radical change of heart: A New Testament Commentary.
cf. Heb.11:23-26
- b. Moses acts as savior and judge to Israelites. vv.11-15 cf. Acts 7:25
- c. Moses acts as savior to Gentiles. vv.16,17
- d. Moses mellows. He marries, has a son and tends sheep. vv.18-22

III. A Deliverer Pleaded For: Groans and Cries Ascend to God. vv.23-25

- a. God *hears* their groaning. v.23 cf. Psa.34:15; 40:1
- b. God *remembers* His covenant with the Patriarchs. v.24 cf. Dt.7:6-8
“To Hebrew thought ‘to remember’ is ‘to act’ (Alan Cole) cf. Gen.8:1
- c. God *looks down* and acknowledges. v.25 cf. Ex.3:7; Amos 3:2
