I Text:

Old Covenant: *Proverbs 1:1-10* New Covenant: *Matthew 23:29-39; Romans 2:12-16*

II Doctrine: A true Mother must be a woman of God first. She reigns in her home as a coheir of the world to come with her husband. She must be steeped and trained in the Word of God. The faithful Mother will train her children to be wise in their orthodoxy and orthopraxy, concerning the Christian faith. Especially in a wicked generation, a mother must instruct her children in the laws of Jesus Christ, as opposed to Man's law. Everyone is responsible for breaking the moral law of God. III Application:

2) She must be steeped and trained in the Word of God. The faithful Mother will train her children to be wise in their orthodoxy and orthopraxy, concerning the Christian faith. (*Proverbs 1:5-10*)

3) Especially in a wicked generation, a mother must instruct her children in the laws of Jesus Christ, as opposed to Man's law. *(Matthew 23:29-39)*

4) Everyone is responsible for breaking the moral law of God. This "natural law" is hardwired into the consciousness of Man. God's people are especially accountable because we have the law of God on our hearts and expounded upon in scripture. The legal principle of **ignorantia juris non excusat** (ignorance of the law excuses not) or **ignorantia legis neminem excusat** (ignorance of law excuses no one) is derived from Roman law. Essentially, it means that if someone breaks the law, he or she is still liable even if they had no knowledge of the law being broken.
