 - A. How do men get into "the depths?" (Psalm 42:7, 69:1-2, Hebrews 5:7)
 - B. There is much to learn from this good model of prayer (Matth. 6:9-13)
 - C. The psalmist asks for his prayer to be heard v. 2 (Ps. 119:149)
- III. <u>God's mercy is magnified by His full and free divine forgiveness</u> <u>vv. 3-4</u>
 - A. God is gracious to "not" mark the iniquities of His people. v. 3 (Psalm 143:2, Ps. 1:5, Jude 24, Rom. 3:20-26)
 - B. A glorious transition and truth! v.4 (Eph. 2:4, Ps. 86:5, 1 Jn. 2:2, Col. 1:14, Eph. 1:7, Rom 2:4)
 - C. Your response should be reverence and honor to God. v. 4b (Jer.33:8-9)
- IV. <u>Do you demonstrate a resolute patience in waiting for the Lord?</u> <u>vv.5-6</u>
 - A. The psalmist patiently waits on the Lord (Ps. 27:13-14)
 - B. The Word of God is a buttress during these times of distress v. 5b (Ps. 119:49, Rom. 8:24-25)
 - C. An eager expectation for something great adds to one's ability to be patient
- V. <u>Have you experienced redemption and deliverance from your</u> sins? vv.7-8
 - A. With our God, there is more than forgiveness, there is deliverance from sin (Gal. 3:29)
 - B. God is faithful to fulfill His promises v. 7b-8 (Matth. 1:21)
