Acts 6: 8 – 15

The Case Against Stephen

1. Stephen Is Proclaiming that Jesus Is the Christ.

2. Christ's Opponent's Use the Same Playbook.

3. The Glory of Christ Shines Through His People.

Scripture records the resistance that Stephen (representing this new office of Deacons) encounters from those opposed to Christ. It seems crazy that anyone would oppose caring for widows, but they hate Christ and all for which He stands. Their strategy is predictable. They distort the truth and stir up dissension just like the Father of Lies always does. The way of Life is always opposed by the forces of death. At least for the moment. Stephen's radiance points us to the coming glory when we will be with our Savior King face-to-face. Let us so trust in the coming of that Day that we are willing to live to His glory today and every day until then.

Matthew 4:17 From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Galatians 3:7 – 9

"Know then that it is those of faith who are the sons of Abraham. And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "In you shall all the nations be blessed." So then, those who are of faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.

Matthew 5: 17 – 20

¹⁷ "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. ¹⁸ For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
