Romans 8:33,34 IT IS GOD THAT JUSTIFIETH

- I. The figure of speech is that of a courtroom trial before a judge.
 - A. Questions (cf. Isaiah 50:8,9)
 - 1. Is there an accusation (33a)?
 - 2. And is there a charge which would stick, making one worthy of condemnation (34a)?
 - B. It is the "elect" about whom this question is asked.
- II. The only correct answer: "It is God that justifieth" (cf. Isa. 50:8,9,7).
 - A. This is an activity of God!!
 - B. To justify is a legal declaration by the divine Judge about our legal position before Him.
 - 1. It is God making the judgment about someone that they are holy and righteous.
 - 2. This divine pronouncement was made once and it lasts forever, not matter how many times we still sin.
 - 3. Into this divine court no one can bring an accusation which will stick.
- III. The evidence that God has justified us is provided in the four things Jesus did and does to accomplish this for us.
 - A. First, "Christ died."
 - B. Second, "yea rather, that is risen again."
 - C. Third, Christ "is even at the right hand of God."
 - D. Fourth, Christ "also maketh intercession for us."
- IV. God's conclusion is that no one and nothing can take from us the salvation Jesus accomplished for us.
