Call to Worship

Reading from the Law

This law is an expression of the principle that we are to be concerned about the affairs and needs of others, not simply our own, and in this way we are obligated to bear the burdens even of those who are our enemies. How many of us can say that this is the way we treat others, especially our enemies?

Exodus 23: 4, 5 ESV

4"If you meet your enemy's ox or his donkey going astray, you shall bring it back to him. 5 If you see the donkey of one who hates you lying down under its burden, you shall refrain from leaving him with it; you shall rescue it with him.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

The emphasis in this confession, in accord with our theme today, is on our failure to attend diligently to the needs of others, especially those in our spiritual family, the Church.

God in heaven,

We confess that You have given each of us various gifts with which we can serve others, but instead we have used them to serve only ourselves.

We confess that instead of looking around at how we may serve others as You have called us, we look inward and spend our efforts of service on ourselves.

We confess that Your church, the one for which our Lord Jesus came to die, receives so little of our attention and efforts, and yet we are so quick to criticize its work and worship.

We confess that we would rather not spend our valuable time, energy, and talents on this group whom God has called to be salt and light in a broken world.

We confess that we are careless in these many areas, and we ask for Your forgiveness, oh God. We ask that You would renew our hearts and move us toward love and service of neighbor, bearing burdens, that we might be light in a dark world, that others may come to know the Savior Jesus who gave Himself fully for us.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

Our hope is in the Lord's compassion for us, His people. That compassion is possible because in Christ He Himself has borne the burden of our sin and accepted its full punishment on our behalf. This is good news!

Psalm 103:8-13 ESV

8 The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
9 He will not always chide,
nor will he keep his anger forever.
10 He does not deal with us according to our sins,
nor repay us according to our iniquities.
11 For as high as the heavens are above the earth,
so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him;
12 as far as the east is from the west,
so far does he remove our transgressions from us.
13 As a father shows compassion to his children,
so the Lord shows compassion to those who fear him.

Sermon

"The Burden of Love" (Rev. Brent Corbin)

Ruth 3:1-18 ESV

1 Then Naomi her mother-in-law said to her, "My daughter, should I not seek rest for you, that it may be well with you? 2 Is not Boaz our relative, with whose young women you were? See, he is winnowing barley tonight at the threshing floor. 3 Wash therefore and anoint yourself, and put on your cloak and go down to the threshing floor, but do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking. 4 But when he lies down, observe the place where he lies. Then go and uncover his feet and lie down, and he will tell you what to do." 5 And she replied, "All that you say I will do."

6 So she went down to the threshing floor and did just as her mother-in-law had commanded her. 7 And when Boaz had eaten and drunk, and his heart was merry, he went to lie down at the end of the heap of grain. Then she came softly and uncovered his feet and lay down. 8 At midnight the man was startled and turned over, and behold, a woman lay at his feet! 9 He said, "Who are you?" And she answered, "I am Ruth, your servant. Spread your wings over your servant, for you are a redeemer." 10 And he said, "May you be blessed by the Lord, my daughter. You have made this last kindness greater than the first in that you have not gone after young men, whether poor or rich. 11 And now, my daughter, do not fear. I will do for you all that you ask, for all my fellow townsmen know that you are a worthy woman. 12 And now it is true that I am a redeemer. Yet there is a redeemer nearer than I. 13 Remain tonight, and in the morning, if he will redeem you, good; let him do it. But if he is not willing to redeem you, then, was the Lord lives, I will redeem you. Lie down until the morning."

14 So she lay at his feet until the morning, but arose before one could recognize another. And he said, "Let it not be known that the woman came to the threshing floor." 15 And he said, "Bring the garment you are wearing and hold it out." So she held it, and he measured out six measures of barley and put it on her. Then she went into the city. 16 And when she came to her mother-in-law, she said, "How did you fare, my daughter?" Then she told her all that the man had done for her, 17 saying, "These six measures of barley he gave to me, for he said to me, 'You must not go back empty-handed to your mother-in-law." 18 She replied, "Wait, my daughter, until you learn how the matter turns out, for the man will not rest but will settle the matter today."

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.

Offering Meditation

2 Corinthians 8:1-5 ESV

I We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, 2 for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. 3 For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord, 4 begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints—5 and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us.
