Sermon: "We Need King Messiah!" What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 9

I Text:

Old Covenant: Judges 2:16-23 New Covenant: 2 Peter 2:10-22

II Doctrine:

This part of the book of Judges explains the main theme of the book. Like a movie "spoiler" we are told the cycle of events that will be repeated in the story. God's people cannot break their cycle of sin.

God repeatedly provides a temporary deliverer called a Judge. A Judge in this context is a military leader who delivers the people from bondage. God is merciful and hears the cries of his people. But just like us his people return to their sin after their deliverance.

The unfaithful ways of God's covenant people caused him to leave their enemies in the land. Only when we are forced to interact with our enemies can our faith be tested. God's people cannot be tested if they reside in an "echo chamber". We are to be mature and battle hardened for the Lord.

God's people cannot be tested if they reside in an "echo chamber". We are to be mature and battle hardened for the Lord. (*Judges* 2:21-23; *Jeremiah* 31:31-40)
