 - c. How is this exemplified with Ehud? With Barak?
- 8. What *do* we usually learn from history? What *should* we learn from Bible history? (See Ps.107:43)
- 9. What three promises does God make to us? (see Dt.30:1-3)
- 10. How is His *faithfulness* to each of these promises exemplified in Judges 3-5?
- 11. How is God's goodness evident in His faithfulness to each of these promises?
