I. Available Vessel - and dependable

A. For fellowship

B. To glorify Him

C. Be usable

II. A Clean Vessel 1 Th 4:4 That every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honour;

Isa 66:20 bring an offering in a clean vessel into the house of the LORD. Christianity is not just a high-sounding ritual which we perform on Sundays. Christianity is abiding by Biblical standards of personal holiness and in turn seeking to bring holiness into the society in which we live.

Daniel purposed not to defile himself

Judges 16:4-30 Sin will:

- 1. Take you farther than you wanted to go 4-20
- 2. Keep you longer than you wanted to stay 21
- 3. Cost you more than you were willing to pay 30

The secret of true obedience is the clear and close personal relationship to God. All our attempts after full obedience will be failures until we get access to his abiding fellowship. It is God's holy presence consciously abiding with us that keeps us from disobeying Him. I must consciously include the Lord in every thought, activity, and conversation until the habit is established. -- Andrew Murray

David Livingstone wrote in his journal concerning his "selfless" life: People talk of the sacrifice I have made in spending so much of my life in Africa. Can that be called a sacrifice which is simply paying back a small part of the great debt owing to our God, which we can never repay? Is that a sacrifice which brings its own blest reward in healthful activity, the consciousness of doing good, peace of mind and a bright hope of glorious destiny hereafter? Away with the word in such a view and with such a thought! It is emphatically no sacrifice. Say rather it is a privilege.
