- God's Covenant with Abraham -- Genesis 17:1-7
- God's House as His Sanctuary -- ref. 2:14-16; cf. also Psalm 5:7, 23:6, 26:8, 27:4, 42:4; Micah 4:1-2; Haggai 1:1-2:9; Zechariah 1:16; Luke 6:1-4
- Dwelling in God's House is Dwelling with Him, an inheritance promised to His faithful ref. Psalm 52:7-8, 65:4, 84:1-4, 92:12-13
- The Messiah would Gather People into God's Presence in His Dwelling Place cf. Isaiah 2:1-4 with 11:1-13, cf. also 49:1-13 with 51:14-52:15 and 53:1-12 with 54:1-17; ref. also Zechariah 2-3, 6:9-15
