Ancient Geography Essential

- Prophetic language requires understanding the ancient world as Zechariah or text will be incomprehensible
- Knowledge of ancient cultures increased past 200 years
- Cultures mentioned represent future cultures
- O Zechariah is a study of contrasts with flexible time line

A Look at Prophetic Time (32 4)1621)

- O Christ reads Isaiah, stopping in mid-sentence (1-46-1-46
 - He sits saying Isaiah words are fulfilled in Him
 - He does not lay claim to the remainder of Isaiah's prophecy during His first advent (Suffering Messiah)
 - Remainder will be fulfilled in His second advent (Conquering King)
 - Zechariah weaves the prophecies covering both advents

Troy - War That Shaped Empires

- Conflict between two confederations
- Protracted war exhausted both cultures
- Collapse of these cultures resulted in Sea Peoples (Colonization – Philistia)

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Phoenicia - Maritime Power

- O Semitic Bahrain culture
- Developed alphabet
- Maritime traders, settlers
- O Craftsmen built Temple
- Brought silver from Iberia for Solomon

Collapse of Ancient Cultures

- Egypt severely weakened by events of Hebrew Exodus
- Hittite Empire weakened attempting to conquer coast
- Confederation (Trojan) war collapsed their cultures
- O Phoenicia able to become a strong maritime power
- Sea Peoples est, colonies such as Philistia (Philistines)

Growth of New Cultures

- God moved Hebrews into Canaan during this time
 - O They struggled to est, themselves (Judges)
 - O David conquered Philistia, solidifying monarchy (Israel)
 - O Solomon traded with Phoenicia as far as Malaysia (10) 10-110
- Eastern empires declined, defeated by Western empires
- O Macedonia brought Hellenism to the East: Alexander

Zechariah's View of Empires

- Common to use city names to denote Empires
- Phoenicia upper coast
- Philistia lower coast -
- Damascus (Syria) north of Israel



Politic Point of View

- Hadrach (חדרה) Possibly means: Hard Soft
 - Only used here
 - Does not correlate with known deities or cultures
- O Probably euphemism for Persia to protect Judea
 - Persia sensitive to prophecies of insurrection
 - O Jews would lose status & power in Persian court

Division of Final Two Visions

- O Contrast similar to God's answer on fastings
 - O First vision God's message of judgment heavy burden
 - O Gentiles are hard Experience God's wrath (Salvation)
 - O God is soft Christ seen as humble coming for His own
 - Second vision God's message of Jacob's Trouble
 - O God is hard Great Tribulation to sift His people
 - O Jews are soft They mourn for Messiah Priestly nation

Contrast Judgment & Salvation

- The burden of God Judgment comes to Hadrach Persia and by implication: all who reject Christ/God
 - O Burden of sin weighs heavily on man
 - O Burden is carried alone Man rejected God (Re-1/18-32)
- O In contrast the burden of Christ is light 04: 11.25-80
 - He bore the burden on the stauros
 - He bears the burden in life dwelling in us

Burden Rests on Syria

- Syria identified by:
 - Hamath (Fortress) Area of Syria
 - Damascus Capital of Syria
- They had the greatest witness of God Rejected God
 - Naaman (Syrian General) leprosy healed Elijah (300 5-1-14)
 - Syrians acknowledged Elijah as God's prophet QK(8745)

Phoenicia: Tyre & Sidon

- O Phoenicia wealthy cities
 - Sidon frequently defeated - Land based
 - Tyre rarely conquered
- Alexander built bridge
 - Razed the city
 - Survivors built Carthage (Rome - Punic Wars)

Philistia Enters God's Salvation

- Philistia saw the destruction of Phoenicia knowing her time would come
 - Sons of early Mycenae victors (Troy) defeated by Greek warriors of Alexander the Great - Ruled by foreigners
 - Their idolatric system suddenly destroyed Dagon (Fish)
- In Millennial Kingdom they will be called a tribe of friends in Israel

Christ Camps Over His House

- Refers to His people (House of David); not a dwelling
 - Christ shall live in Israel to protect His people
 - O Seeing with His own eyes means He is physically present
 - Late in Millennial Kingdom HaSatan and unbelievers will attempt to destroy God's people and Christ @c 2007-00
- In a few passages God moves from Zechariah's future, our past, to our future

Synopsis

- God reassures His people that Gentiles who harm them will be harmed regardless of wealth or power
- Some Gentiles enemies will become friends such as the Jebusites (Jerusalem) (Jun 15-05, Jul 1-21, 250-24-18-25, 1Ch 18-49)
 - Hebrews told to destroy the Jebusites but could not
 - Temple built on Jebusite threshing floor in Jerusalem

Exact Declarations Not Possible

- Impossible to determine exact peoples (cultures) since some events in unknowable future context
- Those knowable peoples & events can be near-view fulfillment and still refer to far-view fulfillment
- Can be dogmatic about flow of prophetic events but not about specific participants - Danger to avoid

Some Current Issues Possible

- It is possible to draw some conclusions from current events if qualifying statements are clearly understood
 - The foreigners ruling Philistia would correspond to today's Palestinian Gaza Strip area (Approximately)
 - Islam (Sharia) is the foreign replacement of ancient religious traditions (Dagon)
 - Islam's avowed purpose is to destroy all other faiths Rejects Scripture for distorted Talmud; Quran

What Is Learned?

- O To understand prophecy:
 - O History is essential {Zechariah refers to Greeks Javans}
 - Prophetic relationships are otherwise unknowable
 - O Prophetic timelines may change mid-sentence Careful
- O Hard Gentiles will be carry their own burden of sin
- Coming: Soft Christ to carry burden of His peoples
