<p style="text-align: center;"><b>INTRO, DEUTERONOMY</b></p> <p>The title means “Second Law” ( it is actually an expansion &amp; interpretation of the first law) Called also “The Words.” (from opening phrase in 1:1, referring to the fact that these are Moses’ parting words.) Also called the “Book of Remembrance,” and the “Upper Desert Discourse.” The setting is the plains of Moab due east of Jericho and the Jordan. It covers about one month (Deut 1:3, 34:8, Joshua 5:6-12) of the year 1405 BC. It is comprised of three sermons: First, 1:1-4:3. Obedience vs. disobedience. Second, 4:44-26:19. Moral &amp; legal &amp; ceremonial &amp; civil &amp; social duties. Third, 27-34. History in advance. Joshua appointed, Moses dies. (enters Promised Land at Mount of Transfiguration , Matthew 17:3)</p> <p>Christ: 18:15, a “prophet like me.” (John 1:21). Moses, a type of Christ: the prophet-priest-ruler, giver of a law, instituter of a covenant, faithful in all His House (Hebrews 3:1-3), in danger of death during childhood, a savior, intercessor, rejected by brothers.</p>	<p>12.
