I.	<u>C</u> or <u>C</u>
	Control: Eph 1:11. Affirm Submit to Your providence: how long I live, how I die, my limitations for success, what happens to people I love
	Commands: praying for obedience to His revealed will
II.	<u>P</u> and <u>P</u>
	Pervasive: see more and more come to obey Him
	Eg: a just, truthful, merciful, wise president and administration and congress from the next elections
	Personal: not just them; begin with me!
	Your will be done in <i>my</i> life today. I want to submit to it.
III.	P or P
	Partial: Your will be done—sort of, generally
	Perfect: "as in heaven" where the angels obey instantly and completely (Psm 103:20-21)
	Cf. Jesus: Heb 10:7; Jn 4:34; 14:31 Gethsemane: Matt 26:39 The cost was the Cross—to die for you, who have <i>not</i> done His will Remember this with Lord's Supper

- We His disciples are learning to trust and obey (Matt 28:18-19)
- So before you ask for any of your needs, you here begin with the prior desire for *His* will to be done
- Larry Crabb: we see prayer as trying to prevail on God to give us what we want. But prayer is mainly about knowing **God**. Relational prayer before petitionary prayer.
- Try this week thinking about what God is like, and what His will looks like before you begin to ask for anything.
