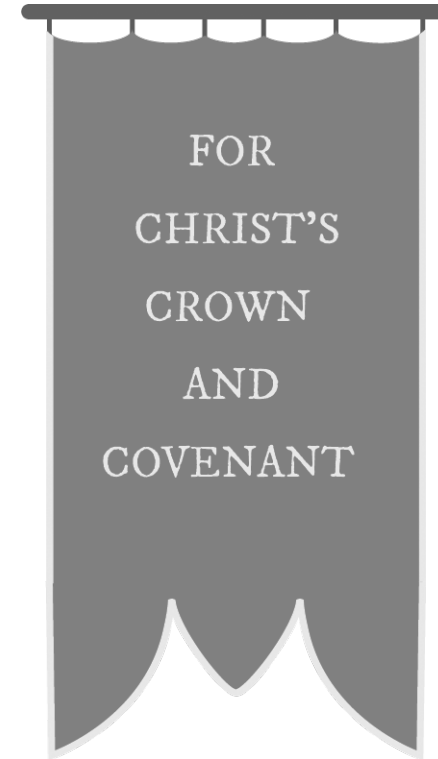
Pray...
