I. Look-"the glory of God appeared" (vs. 10-15)

He excels past:

- A. Negativity "I have heard the murmuring"
- **B.** Nature "behold, upon the face of the wilderness"
- C. Normal "for they wist not what it was"
- **II.** Lean -"this is the thing...the LORD commanded" (vs. 16-18) *He excites us for:*
 - **A.** Gathering "Gather of it every man"
 - **B.** Giving "take ye every man for them...in his tents"
 - C. Gratitude "some more, some less"
- III. Listen "Let no man leave of it until the morning" (vs. 19-21)

 He exposes our:
 - A. Stubbornness "they hearkened not unto Moses"
 - **B.** Stinginess "it bred worms, and stank"
 - C. Slothfulness -"when the sun waxed hot, it melted"

Sentence Sermon:

"God is glorified when others see our high opinion of Him in the way we live our lives."
