# The Body of Christ, Spiritual Gifts, and Spiritual Maturity, Part 10 "Love is not Arrogant" 1 Corinthians 13:4

#### The Apostle's Teaching on the Characteristics of Love - Overview:

- 1. Everything in these verses is behavioral.
- 2. Paul is interested to apply these things especially in relationships in the body of Christ.
- 3. Paul begins his portrait of love as it shows itself amidst the sins and offenses of a fallen world.
- 4. "Love" Gk. AGAPE

## Arrogance snuffs out love; love dispels arrogance!

- 1. Arrogance Snuffs out Love!
- "Love does not parade itself, is not puffed up."

## (1) Definitions:

- "parading oneself" Gk: PERPEREUOMAI (only here in the NT) Elsewhere has overtones of ostentatious bragging ESV: "does not boast"
- "puffed up" Gk: PHUSIOUTAI → PHUSIO from PHUSIS: "bellows" cf. ESV: "is not arrogant"
- (2) The immediate reference: 12:21

- What is operating here?

"And the eve cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you,'; nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.' "

- Pride and self-sufficiency!
- Failure to appreciate that the body consists of all of its members!
- Failure to recognize that what I have all that I have I have received from God!
- A despising of my brother and his gifts!

### - What are the consequences?

- -1- I contribute to schism in the body
  - Damaging fellowship I can't really listen to others if I'm always talking about myself!
  - Discouraging my brothers and sisters in the use of their gifts.
- -2- I am unable to benefit fully from the gifts of my brothers and sisters
  - I like to be served (!), but I do not fully appreciate the service I receive!

-3- My own effectiveness and fruitfulness in service is greatly diminished.

- Other consequences seen at Corinth "puffed up" occurs in all of these contexts
- -1- 4:6-13 Puffed up with my own knowledge, gifts, I may be self-defiant, unteachable!
- -2-5:1-2 Puffed up with my own knowledge, gifts, I may be oblivious to more weighty issues of purity and holiness!
- -3- 8:1-13 Puffed up with my own knowledge, and glorying in my "liberty," I may harm my brother!

### 2. Love Dispels Arrogance!

- The Corresponding Positive Operation of Love:
- (1) I am kept from arrogance and am enabled to love my brother when I remember that my gifts are entirely from God!
- (2) I am kept from arrogance and am enabled to love my brother when I measure my spiritual maturity, not by my gifts, but by the fruit of the Spirit.
- (3) I am kept from arrogance and am enabled to love my brother when I bear in mind that the Spirit of God dwells in him and is working through him.
- (4) I am kept from arrogance and am enabled to love my brother when I remember that the One who is the source of all gifts emptied Himself and became a servant for my sake!
