Exodus 3:7-15 Moses meets God at the Burning Bush

Then the LORD said, "I have surely seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters. I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the place of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites.

And now, behold, the cry of the people of Israel has come to me, and I have also seen the oppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. **Come, I will send you** to Pharaoh that you may bring my people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "**Who am I** that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" He said, "**But I will be with you**, and this shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain."

• God promises his people Salvation and Abundance.

Who am I?

"Come, I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring my people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" Exodus 3:10-11

- i. God tells Moses that his plan to save Israel is to send...Moses!
 - God's plan is to send people like you and me
- ii. Moses responds: "Who am I?"
 - He is effectively saying, I'm a nobody nothing in my identity makes me the right person for the job
 - In short, Moses answers, "I am not..."
 - What is the answer to the question: "Who am I?"
- iii. Who am I? What is your identity? (Genesis 1:26-31, 2:15, Romans 5, 7)
 - A human being
 - Male and female (Genesis 1:27)
 - A multiplier of worshippers (Genesis 1:27)
 - A steward of God's creation
 - God put man "in the garden to work it and keep it"
 - A human being created "in the image of God"
 - We represent God
 - We reflect God
 - A human being created "in the image of God" who is marred by sin
 - We are under the curse of sin through Adam (Romans 5:12-20)
 - We want to do good but we fall short (Romans 7:15)

For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate...¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing.

- God's plan is to send people like you and me, and to be with us!
 - "God with us" is a central theme of the Bible Matthew 1:23, Matthew 28:20, John 1:14, Gal 2:20, Col 1:27b, Revelation 21:3

Exodus 3:13-14

- i. Moses asks God his name (Who are you?).
- ii. God answers "I AM" (14-15)
 - I AM who I AM
 - The God who is
 - The God who is eternal
 - The God who causes everything else to be
 - The God who creates and sustains
 - The God who defines existence and reality
 - The God who is truth
 - The God who never changes
 - "I AM has sent me to you"

iii. Your Identity is rooted in Jesus Christ

■ Jesus identified himself as I AM (John 8:58)

I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.
