- I. Introduction: Do you want to draw near to God?
- II. The desire for God's presence David seeks to bring the ark to Jerusalem. v. 1-2
  - A. David is a king who is devoted to worship. Acts 13:22 I Sam. 16:7 Deut. 17:18 I Chron. 22-28
  - B. What is the ark of God? Ex. 25:10ff
    - 1. The ark was a gold plated wooden box (3 3/4 feet long 2 1/4 feet wide and tall).
    - 2. The ark contained a jar holding manna, Aaron's rod which budded, and the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments. Ex. 16:32-34 25:16 Nu. 17:10 Heb. 9
    - 3. On top of the ark was the mercy seat which was the place of propitiation. Ex. 25:17,21f Ro. 3:25 Lev. 16:2,29-34 Heb. 9:5
    - 4. The mercy seat was symbolically guarded by golden cherubim which represent how access to God's holy presence is restricted. v. 2b Ex. 25:18-19 Heb. 9:5
    - 5. The ark was equipped with gold rings so it could be carried by the Levites using poles. Ex. 25:12-15 Josh. 3:14ff
    - 6. The ark represents the LORD's presence among His people. Ex. 25:22 Nu. 10:35f a. The ark signifies that the LORD rules over Israel. I Chron. 28:2
      - b. The ark signifies the way God's people can be reconciled to Him. Le. 16:14-15
      - c. The ark signifies God's revelation to His people. Ex. 25:16,21 Deut. 10:1-5
    - 7. The ark was holy to the LORD -- Don't touch. Don't even look. Num. 4:15
    - 8. Where had the ark been prior to David's plan to move it? I Sam. 4-6
  - C. David's intentions are good he wants to restore proper worship. <u>Ps. 132:2-5</u>

## III. The failed pursuit of God's presence - David learns about the LORD's holiness. v. 3-11

- A. As the ark is being transported to Jerusalem, disaster strikes. v. 3-7a
  - 1. They put the ark on a new cart under the supervision of Uzzah and Ahio. v. 3-4
  - 2. David and all of Israel accompany the ark in joyful procession. v. 5
  - 3. Uzzah tries to lend a hand when the ark starts to fall off the cart. v. 6
  - 4. The LORD strikes Uzzah dead. v. 7a,8
- **B.** Why did Uzzah die?
  - 1. Some might think this is harsh, arbitrary, or unfair.
  - 2. The LORD had specifically revealed how the ark was to be transported by certain Levites using poles. Num. 4:4ff Deut. 10:8 I Sam. 6:7
  - 3. The LORD had made it very clear that the ark was not to be touched or even looked into. Num. 4:15 I Sa. 6:19
  - 4. Uzzah, along with David and all Israel, failed to show proper reverence for the LORD's holiness. v. 7b <u>I Chron. 15:13</u>
  - 5. Instead of complaining about the LORD's harshness we should marvel at His mercy that He let them get this far and that He didn't wipe them all out!
- C. David experiences a variety of emotions in the aftermath. v. 8-11
  - 1. First he is angry. v. 8
  - 2. Then he is fearful. v. 9-10 Pr. 1:7
  - 3. Then he becomes hopeful. v. 11-12
  - 4. Then he moves the ark into Jerusalem in the LORD's way, resulting in great joy. v. 13ff I Chr. 15:12ff

## IV. The LORD is still holy and is not to be trifled with.

- A. Those who fail to respect His holiness will suffer His judgment. Lev. 10:1ff Dan. 5
  - 1. Do such judgments occur under the New Covenant? I Cor. 11:29f Acts 5:1-11
  - 2. The LORD's people are often guilty about being careless about the things of God.
  - **3.** God's work must be done by God's people in God's way sincerity and good intentions are not enough.
  - 4. Judgment begins with the household of God. I Pe. 4:17
- B. God's Name is noly. Ex. 20:7
- C. God's Word is holy. II Ti. 3:16-17 Deut. 18:19 Rev. 22:18-19 Js. 4:17
- D. God's church is holy. Eph. 2:21-22 I Pe. 2:5 I Ti. 2:15
- E. God's worship is holy. John 4:24
  - 1. God has revealed how He wants to be worshiped. Heb. 12:28f Acts 2:42
  - 2. We are not free to replace what God has proscribed with our own traditions. Ex. 20:4-6 Mt. 15:6 I Pe. 5:8 I Sam. 15:22
  - 3. Take our participation in worship seriously. II Ti. 2:15 I Cor. 11:29ff Acts 2:42
- V. Conclusion: The LORD still desires us to come into His holy presence.
  - A. How then can we who are unclean approach God? Heb. 9:1ff
  - B. Jesus fulfills what the ark represents.
    - 1. Through Him God is present with us. Isa. 7:14
    - 2. He reveals God to us. John 1:1,14,18 Col. 2:9
    - 3. He is the bread from heaven. John 6:31ff
    - 4. He reconciles us to God having made propitiation for our sin. I Jo. 2:2 Ro. 3:25 Heb. 9:11ff 9:27 II Co. 5:21
    - 5. Through Him we draw near to God. John 14:6 Heb. 9:8 4:16 6:19ff 10:19
  - C. We have a great challenge presenting this message to the world.
    - 1. People today, like Uzzah, don't realize how dirty they are and how holy God is.
    - 2. People are offended by a God of holiness and justice.
    - **3.** Most believe they can approach God any way they please, as long as they are sincere.
    - 4. Jesus is the only way to approach God. John 14:6 Acts 4:12
