

## *Preserving Our Brotherly Love*

### Matthew 5:21-26

#### Main Point:

Instead of being angry, Jesus wants you to love one another as He has loved you; therefore, preserve your loving relationships with one another by quickly seeking reconciliation in times of conflict, no matter what the cost.

1. In order for you to keep the Law for Him, Jesus teaches you what the Law truly requires.

2. Like murder, being angry with someone is a violation of the sixth commandment.

3. Instead of being angry, Jesus wants you to love one another as He has loved you.

4. Preserve your loving relationships with one another by quickly seeking reconciliation in times of conflict, no matter what the cost.

**1 Corinthians 13:4a** <sup>4</sup> Love is patient and kind ... (ESV)

**1 John 3:15-16** <sup>15</sup> Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. <sup>16</sup> By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down *our* lives for the brethren. (NKJV)

**Philippians 2:3-8** <sup>3</sup> *Let* nothing *be done* through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. <sup>4</sup> Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, <sup>7</sup> but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, *and* coming in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup> And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to *the point of* death, even the death of the cross. (NKJV)

**John 15:12** <sup>12</sup> "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. (NKJV)

**Matthew 18:15** <sup>15</sup> "Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. (NKJV)

**Ephesians 4:26b** <sup>26</sup> ... do not let the sun go down on your anger (ESV)

**Colossians 1:21-22** <sup>21</sup> And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup> he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him. (ESV)
