### God uses adverse circumstances to advance the gospel (1:12)

- Paul's circumstances: Imprisonment
- Paul's confidence: Gospel advancement

#### God uses adverse circumstances to advance the gospel in believers (1:14)

- Adversity fuels trust in the Lord
- Adversity fuels boldness with the gospel

## **Principles for Evangelism:**

- God desires to advance the gospel through our everyday circumstances
- Opportunities for the gospel must be taken
- Our boldness or lack of boldness with the gospel impacts one another in the church
- Our quickness or slowness to tell others about Jesus is a gauge of our trust in the Lord.

- Fear often keeps us from telling others about Jesus, but Jesus is with you when you do (Matt. 28:20; Luke 10:16)
- Boldness comes through prayer by the Holy Spirit (Acts 4:29, 31)
  Evangelism always means speaking the Word of God.
