## **Psalm 110 in the New Testament**

1. When Jesus asserted himself as the fulfillment of Psalm 110, they convicted Him of blasphemy:

Mark 14:61-64

- a. Jesus used Psalm 110 to claim a lordship greater than the kings of David. (Mark 12:35-37)
- b. Jesus used Psalm 110 with Daniel 7:13 to claim the seat of eternal sovereign authority. (Mark 14:62)
- c. Jesus used Psalm 110 with Daniel 7:13 to claim that His rule would someday be extended to earth. (Mark 14:62)

Hebrews 1:13

Psalm 110 is a key part of the argument that Jesus is the great God and King. *Know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ.* Jesus is your God and King, far greater than the kings of David, seated at the right hand of God with eternal power, and someday bringing the kingdom to earth.

- 2. Because Jesus is at the right hand of God as the King and Priest of Psalm 110, everything is different:
  - a. Your past is forgiven.

Hebrews 8:1, 10:12

Acts 2:38

Romans 8:33-34 Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. <sup>34</sup> Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died- more than that, who was raised- who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

1 John 2:1 *If anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.* 

b. Your present is blessed.

Ephesians 1:19-22 [praying ... that you may know...] what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might  $^{20}$  that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places ...  $^{22}$  And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church,

Col. 3:1-3 If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup> Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. <sup>3</sup> For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.... <sup>9</sup> you have put off the old self with its practices <sup>10</sup> and have put on the new self...

c. Your future will be without enemies.

1 Corinthians 15:25–26 For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.
