# The Body of Christ, Spiritual Gifts, and Spiritual Maturity, Part 11 "Love does not Behave Rudely" 1 Corinthians 13:5

### The Apostle's Teaching on the Characteristics of Love – Overview:

- 1. Everything in these verses is behavioral.
- 2. Paul is interested to apply these things especially in relationships in the body of Christ.
- 3. Paul begins his portrait of love as it shows itself amidst the sins and offenses of a fallen world.
- 4. "Love" Gk. AGAPE
- 5. These things are impossible to the flesh! cf. Gal. 5:16-26

Rude conduct betrays an absence of love; love dispels rudeness!

1. Rude Conduct betrays an absence of Love!

"love...does not behave rudely"

(1) Definition:

-"behave rudely" Gk: ASKEMONEI

+ SKEMA "against" + "form" contrary to the form

- Contrary to the form, fashion, or manner that is proper
  - NASV: "does not act unbecomingly" KJV: "does not behave itself unseemly"
  - To act shamefully, callously, with indifference toward a brother or sister
  - The word is colored by its particular context
- Only other NT use: 1 Cor. 7:36: Used with reference a father who may think he is behaving improperly toward his daughter if he does not allow her to marry
  - i.e., The father does not want to be inconsiderate of her interests or cares or happiness.

### (2) The immediate context:

- 13:4 When pride puffs up the heart,

"love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely' rude conduct will usually and quite naturally follow.

- When I am taken up with myself, interested in "talking myself up", or am self-absorbed, I can be quite oblivious to how I am affecting others by my speech or conduct.

- 12:21

"And the eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you,' "

- "I have no need of you!" A quite rude and callous statement! Paul puts it in the mouth of one who is impressed with his own gifts and importance.
  - When I am taken up with my own agenda (my own importance, gifts), I will communicate to others this sort of thing.
  - When I am taken up with my own agenda, I will in some significant measure be oblivious to body life.

## 2. Love dispels Rude Conduct!

## The Corresponding Positive Operation of Love:

- (1) Love is sensitive to others! Sensitive to their needs, circumstances, and feelings!
- (2) Love is careful to "think on the things of others," not taken up with one's own things.
- (3) In this way love serves and cares for a brother or sister:
  - Love is attuned to the feelings and sensibilities of another
  - Love cares enough about a brother or sister to know them, and so to know their needs and sensibilities
- (4) For these reasons, love is attuned to body life:

Love sees every member as vital! Love sees every gift as precious! Love sees every life as precious!
