- 4. Read **Titus 3:9-11**. While our study of Acts 15 is about essential disputes and debates, how would you differentiate those from the quarrels of a sinfully divisive and contentious person?
- 5. Read **2 Peter 3:18** and **2 Timothy 2:15-16**. What will you do to increase your ability to know when to engage in a godly debate and how to rightly understand God's word in doing so?


