The Labors of the Missionaries in Reporting

(Acts 14:24-28)

Introduction:

- Acts 14:1-28 has four sections. They are ...
- The Labors of the Missionaries in Iconium
- The Labors of the Missionaries in Lycaonia
- The Labors of the Missionaries in Revisiting
- The Labors of the Missionaries in Reporting
- Today we take up The Labors of the Missionaries in Reporting.
- This is recounted in Acts 14:24-28.

The Route Taken:

- Verses 24 and 25 specify the course they followed on their way home:
- "They passed through Pisidia and came into Pamphylia. When they had spoken the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia."

The Destination Identified:

- Verse 26 identifies the destination of their journey:
- "From there they sailed to Antioch, from which they had been commended to the grace of God for the work that they had accomplished."
- This verse not only clarifies the destination, but also the reason for the destination.

The Church Gathered:

- Verse 27a makes clear the context in which they gave their report:
- "When they had arrived and gathered the church together."
- The church is not an informal club.
- It is an organized society.

The Report Given:

- Verse 27b provides the summary of the report:
- "they began to report all things that God had done with them and how He had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles."
- ... they spoke of what God had done with them.
- ... they said that God opened a door of faith to the Gentiles.
- ... this does not mean merely that God gave the Gentiles an opportunity to be saved.

The Visit Prolonged:

- Verse 28 reveals that they settled down with the church in Antioch:
- "And they spent a long time with the disciples."
- The language of the original is striking.
- Luke actually says, "they continued a time *not* a *little* with the disciples."

Practical, Gospel Lessons:

- Lessons about Biblical Missionaries:
- Biblical missionaries need a home or a sending church to which they are accountable.
- Biblical missionaries must report to their home or sending church.
- Biblical missionaries in reporting must emphasize what God has done with them.
- Biblical missionaries must spend time resting and renewing fellowship with their sending church.

Practical, Gospel Lessons:

- Lessons for Biblical Christians:
- All Christians need a church.
- All Christians need to maintain communication with their church.
- All Christians need to speak of what God is doing with them to their church.
- All Christians need to spend time not a little fellowshipping with their church.

Practical, Gospel Lessons:

- Lessons about the Biblical Christ:
- Christ is the source of sovereign grace.
- Christ is the one in whom we must believe.
- Christ is the center of the community we need.
- Christ is the one who calls us to communicate with one another.
