The Heidelberg Catechism

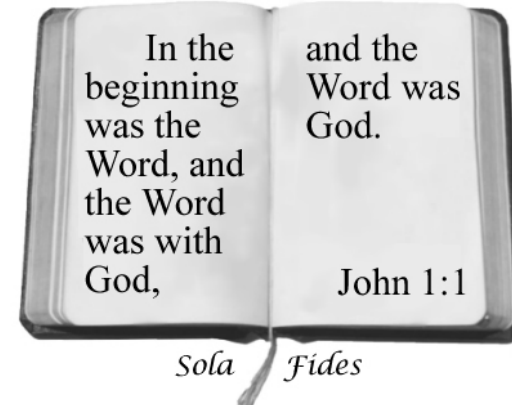
