III. Achieving It All by Resting in Christ

To do Col 3:12-17, we must first accept Col 3:11 as fact. If "Christ is all and in all," then what is true of Christ, must now be true of us.

Embracing God's Word: "Accepting that Christ is all and in all, I put on the virtues of my Lord Jesus Christ. I clothe myself in compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, tolerance, and forgiveness. I forgive others just as Christ has forgiven me. I love my fellow Christian as Christ has loved me—seeking nothing less than his or her good.

I also submit to the peace of my Lord Jesus, the peace that he achieved by his death on the cross. I will not follow the dark ways of this world and contribute to the destruction of others. Instead, I strive to live with those in the kingdom as well as those outside the kingdom out of the peace that Christ has given to me.

I will be thankful. I will remember the deep pit of death, despair, and hopelessness that God the Father has saved me from. I give God the glory for saving me from destruction and for giving me new life in the kingdom of his beloved Son.

I fill my thoughts and speech with the word of Christ. I desire that the thoughts I think and the words I speak be the words of my Lord Jesus. I will not devote my thoughts to the evil one and his ways of thinking. Instead, I seek the replication of Christ in all my thinking and speaking.

Above all, I do all things in the holy name of my Lord Jesus Christ. I place all my work under his rule. I reveal his glory and excellencies in everything that I do."

- 6. How does accepting Col 3:11 help us to become the kind of people that Col 3:12-17 calls for?
