## I. We can have victory in Jesus

## II. 3 Steps in Paul's lesson

- a. The pain (vs 1-4)
- b. The cause of the pain (vs 5-11)
- c. The triumph over the pain (vs 12-17)

## III. Paul's pain

- a. Paul has already had one painful visit
  - i. His \_\_\_\_\_ and his \_\_\_\_\_ are expressed in vs 2
  - ii. He writes so that his in-person visit can be a joy
- b. Paul's wound is deep but only because his \_\_\_\_\_\_for the Corinthian church is deep
  - i. Christ in him and in them is bigger than any pain they can endure
  - ii. We can be so cente4rd on what we want right now, that we completely miss what God has for us in the long run (Col 3:1-4).

# IV. The cause of Paul's pain

- a. If one suffers, they all suffer
- b. Paul's resolution to the pain is for everyone to forgive the offender
  - i. And to restore him to fellowship and love him
    - 1. C.S. Lewis "We all agree that forgiveness is a beautiful idea until we have to practice it.
- c. Paul want the wounds to \_\_\_\_\_. He wants them to \_\_\_\_\_ as they have been \_\_\_\_\_.

# V. Triumph over pain

- a. Paul is disappointed that Titus has not met him in Troas
  - i. He is so distracted that he's having a hard time \_\_\_\_\_\_ the gospel
  - ii. Paul handle his anxiety by thanks God!
    - 1. Who..."in Jesus Christ leads us in \_\_\_\_\_ procession"
- b. Paul gains victory in remembering that he is the aroma of Christ.
- c. The victory we have in Christ is not necessarily over outside forces
  - i. It is victory over the inner struggle
