 - i. "It was the first ordinance that God instituted, even the first thing which he did, after man and woman were created. - c. Third, marriage is honored by the people who were the first to marry.
 - i. Henry Smith: "It is not said that he made the man a wife, but that he built him a wife, meaning that the man and the wife make as it were a house together, and that the building was not perfect until the woman was made as well as the man."

- d. Fourth, marriage is honorable in relation to Christ.
 - i. Hosea 2:19: 19 "I will betroth you to Me forever; Yes, I will betroth you to Me In righteousness and justice, In lovingkindness and mercy;
 - ii. 2 Corinthians 11:2: 2 For I am jealous for you with godly jealousy. For I have betrothed you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

3. THE INSTITUTION OF MARRIAGE

- e. First, note that in verse 22 not only is the creation of Eve mentioned, but the focus is on the institution and godly establishment of holy matrimony between Adam and his wife.

- f. Notice, secondly, that, by definition, marriage is the union of one man and one woman as one flesh.

- g. The third observation we learn from Genesis 2:22-25 is that marriage must be between a man and a woman.
 - i. 1 Cor. 7:2 Nevertheless, because of sexual immorality, let each man have his own wife, and let each woman have her own husband.

- h. Fourth, the only way a man and a woman are to be joined together and become one flesh is through the ordinance of marriage.

 - i. "Whereas all other ordinances were appointed of God by the hands of men, or the hands of angels, marriage was ordained by God himself who cannot err. No man nor angel brought the wife to the husband, but God himself; so marriage hath more honor of God...than all other ordinances of God beside, because He solmenized it himself"
