## Read the Account of Israel's children

Their births are recorded in Genesis 29:1-35; 30:1-24; 35:16-26.

### Colossians 3:23-25

Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord *you will receive the inheritance as your reward*. You are serving the Lord Christ. <sup>25</sup> For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.

### Acts 7:2-5; 51-53

And Stephen said: “Brothers and fathers, hear me. The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham when he was in Mesopotamia, before he lived in Haran, <sup>3</sup> and said to him, ‘Go out from your land and from your kindred and *go into the land that I will show you*.’ <sup>4</sup> Then he went out from the land of the Chaldeans and lived in Haran. And after his father died, God removed him from there into this land in which you are now living. <sup>5</sup> Yet he gave him no *inheritance* in it, not even a foot's length, but *promised to give it to him as a possession and to his offspring after him*, though he had no child ... <sup>51</sup> “You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you always resist the Holy Spirit. As your fathers did, so do you. <sup>52</sup> Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who announced beforehand *the coming of the Righteous One*, whom *you have now betrayed and murdered*, <sup>53</sup> you who received the law as delivered by angels and did not keep it.”

### Acts 13:16-33

“Men of Israel and you who fear God, listen. <sup>17</sup> The God of this people Israel chose our fathers and made the people great during their stay in the land of Egypt, and with uplifted arm he led them out of it. <sup>18</sup> And for about forty years he put up with them in the wilderness. <sup>19</sup> And after destroying seven nations in the land of Canaan, he gave them their land *as an inheritance*. <sup>20</sup> All this took about 450 years. And after that he gave them judges until Samuel the prophet. <sup>21</sup> Then they asked for a king, and God gave them Saul the son of Kish, a man of the tribe of Benjamin, for forty years. <sup>22</sup> And when he had removed him, he raised up David to be their king, of whom he testified and said, ‘I have found in **David** the son of Jesse a man after my heart, who will do all my will.’ <sup>23</sup> *Of this man's offspring God has brought to Israel a Savior, Jesus, as he promised*. <sup>24</sup> Before his coming, John had proclaimed a baptism of repentance to all the people of Israel. <sup>25</sup> And as John was finishing his course, he said, ‘What do you suppose that I am? I am not he. No, but behold, after me one is coming, the sandals of whose feet I am not worthy to untie.’ <sup>26</sup> “Brothers, *sons of the family of Abraham*, and those among you who fear God, to us has been sent the message of this salvation. <sup>27</sup> For those who live in Jerusalem and their rulers, because they did not recognize him nor understand the utterances of the prophets, which are read every Sabbath, fulfilled them by condemning him. <sup>28</sup> And though they found in him no guilt worthy of death, they asked Pilate to have him executed. <sup>29</sup> And when they had carried out all that was written of him, they took him down from the tree and laid him in a tomb. <sup>30</sup> But *God raised him from the dead*, <sup>31</sup> and for many days he appeared to those who had come up with him from Galilee to Jerusalem, *who are now his witnesses* to the people. <sup>32</sup> And we bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, <sup>33</sup> this he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus ...”

### First Corinthians 6:9-11

<sup>9</sup> Or do you not know that **the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God**? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, <sup>10</sup> nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. <sup>11</sup> And *such were some of you*. But you were washed, you were sanctified, *you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God*.

## Sunday Morning

READ **Ruth 4:11-12; First Corinthians 6:9-11; Genesis 29:1-35; Colossians 3:23-25; Acts 7:2-5; 51-53; 13:16-33.** DISCUSS How does this blessing in Ruth mirror covenant blessings? How does Jesus secure our covenant blessings? MEDITATE on **First Kings 3:6-9.** PRAY "Jesus, thank You for *coming as the promised offspring*. Teach us to find our fulfillment in You alone."

## Monday

READ **Ruth 4:11-12; Genesis 29:1-35; First Corinthians 6:9-11.** DISCUSS How do we inherit the Kingdom of God? How are you acting like a co-heir to Christ? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own!* MEDITATE on **First Kings 3:6-9.** PRAY, "Father, thank You for not leaving us as we were, but delivering us in Christ."

## Tuesday

READ **Ruth 4:11-12; Genesis 32:1-12; 35:16-26; Colossians 3:23-25.** DISCUSS How do we benefit from Boaz's blessing? What has his offspring accomplished for us? MEDITATE on **First Kings 3:6-9.** PRAY, "Lord, thank You for washing us, setting us apart, justifying us through coming to redeem us as only You could do."

## Wednesday

READ **Ruth 4:11-12; Genesis 32:1-12; 35:16-26; First Corinthians 6:9-11.** DISCUSS How do we benefit from Boaz's blessing? What has his offspring accomplished for us? MEDITATE on **First Kings 3:6-9.** PRAY, "Lord, thank You for washing us, setting us apart, justifying us through coming to redeem us as only You could do."

### Thursday

READ **Ruth 4:11-12; Genesis 22:15-18; 38:1-30; Numbers 26:1-56; Colossians 3:23-25**. DISCUSS What is significant about Perez? How do his descendants compare with his brothers' in the census? What about this would be seen as a blessing for Ruth and Boaz to emulate? Why? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own!* MEDITATE on **First Kings 3:6-9**. PRAY, "Father God, make us to resemble Christ more and more, we pray."

### Friday

READ **Ruth 4:11-12; First Corinthians 6:9-11; Genesis 29:1-35; Colossians 3:23-25; Acts 7:2-5; 51-53; 13:16-33**. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on **First Kings 3:6-9**. PRAY that we at FCCW would *trust Christ together*.

### Saturday

PREPARE today for *gathered Sunday worship tomorrow*. READ **Ruth 4:1-22**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for *worship services @ the NEW TIME 9:30 am*.

## First Kings 3:6-9

And Solomon said, "You have shown great and steadfast love to your servant David my father, because he walked before you in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart toward you. And you have kept for him this great and steadfast love and have given him a son to sit on his throne this day. And now, O LORD my God, you have made your servant king in place of David my father, although *I am but a little child. I do not know how to go out or come in*. And your servant is in the midst of your people whom you have chosen, *a great people, too many to be numbered or counted for multitude*. Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, *that I may discern between good and evil*, for who is able to govern this your great people?"
