## II. Practical applications

- A. By God's grace, disciples are made. God's people are to make disciples (Matt. 28:19-20).
- B. Because someone claims to be a Christian, disciple of Christ, doesn't mean he/she is a true disciple.
- C. Discipleship is to be a way of life for Christians.
  - 1. Christ loved first, before anyone or anything else
  - 2. Bearing much fruit (vs. 8)
  - 3. Abiding in Him; His words abiding in us
- D. Discipleship disasters
  - 1. Disciples being embarrassed by their teacher
  - 2. Disciples who are preoccupied with themselves
- E. Discipleship learning–class is always in session. Are we awake, listening, doing homework, participating in class projects (Acts 4:14,15)?
