

Your Dead Shall Live
Isaiah 26:13-19

- I. Judgment On “False Lords” (13-16)
 - A. We were oppressed by “anti-Christ’s”
 - B. You have brought them low
 - 1. Death
 - 2. No resurrection
 - 3. No remembrance
 - C. They called for you, but too late (16)
- II. God Glorifies Himself Through His People In The
Midst of Judgment (15)
 - A. The nation increased, in spite of suffering
 - B. The borders were enlarged
 - C. Neither of these were fulfilled in Isaiah’s day –
future fulfillment
 - D. The original “land” promise had “set borders” –
this points to something greater
- III. The Pain of Self-Righteousness and The Pleasure of
Gracious Resurrection (17-19)
 - A. We were under severe discipline
 - B. We tried to accomplish deliverance (pictured as
birth, cf. John 3) on our own – and failed
 - C. Your dead shall live (resurrection)
 - 1. Physically
 - 2. To joy
 - 3. Light & life (Jesus – John 1)
 - D. 1 Corinthians 15
