"Two Houses, Two Foundations" Matthew 7:24-27

(2) Lives, like houses, may on appearance look very similar.

(3) Both the wise man and the foolish man are familiar with the words of Jesus.

(1) The Wise Man "Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock" Jesus provides for us the ultimate question: What does a man do with His Words? -1- He is concerned not with mere appearance; he is concerned to have a sure foundation. 1. The Great Issue: Doing Christ's Words vv. 24, 26 "Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine -2- He has come to understand that the words of Jesus Christ are foundational to all of life. (1) Jesus' Authority Unrivalled! and does them... "But everyone who hears these sayings of Mine - Jesus is the One to whom every man will answer! and does not do them ... " -3- When testing comes, it is very clear what the "superstructure" of his life rests upon. - Jesus' Word constitutes the only standard of judgment! -4- When the ultimate test comes - the judgment, it is made manifest to all. (2) Mere hearing, mere familiarity with Jesus' words is not enough! (1) The Foolish Man "But everyone who hears these sayings of Mine and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand" -1- He is concerned only with appearance, with what other men see. (3) The Great Divide - This determines and reveals whether one is a wise man or a fool! - This determines every man's ultimate destiny! -2- He is not truly interested in things foundational. He is "in a hurry" to do his own thing. -3- Though familiar with the words of Jesus, he has never believed them or done them. 2. Two Houses – Two Lives The Similarities -4- When testing comes, the fragility of his life is revealed. (1) Every man builds a "house!" -5- When the ultimate test comes - the judgment, all will collapse in a moment of time.
