Victory in the Struggle against Sin!

Romans 7:14 For we know that the law is spiritual: but ${f I}$ am carnal, sold under sin. 15 For that which ${f I}$ do ${f I}$ allow not: for what \mathbf{I} would, that do \mathbf{I} not; but what \mathbf{I} hate, that do \mathbf{I} . 16 If then ${f I}$ do that which ${f I}$ would not, ${f I}$ consent unto the law that it is good. 17 Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me_{\bullet} 18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with **me**; but how to perform that which is good \mathbf{I} find not. 19 For the good that ${f I}$ would ${f I}$ do not: but the evil which ${f I}$ would not, that ${f I}$ do. 20 Now if ${f I}$ do that ${f I}$ would not, it is no more ${f I}$ that do it, but sin that dwelleth in ${f me}$. 21 ${f I}$ find then a law, that, when **I** would do good, evil is present with **me**. 22 For ${f I}$ delight in the law of God after the inward man: 23 But ${f I}$ see another law in **my** members, warring against the law of **my** mind, and bringing **me** into captivity to the law of sin which is

in \mathbf{my} members. 24 O wretched man that \mathbf{I} am! who shall deliver \mathbf{me} from the body of this death? 25 \mathbf{I} thank God

through Jesus Christ our

Lord. So then with the mind **I myself** serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

- Historically godly men have argued about who Paul is referring to in this passage when he says "I"
 - Paul refers to himself differently than a lost man would
 - How can he now say that he is sold as a slave to sin after saying he was free in the preceding verses
 - Many thought he was speaking of a lost person or himself before he got saved
 - At the same time he talks like a saved man realizing that he is not good of himself and not able in himself
 - He calls the law good which a lost man would not do
 - The argument is whether he is speaking of the lost, the carnal, someone under conviction, or as I will present it, a

mature Christian hungry to live out who God made him to be!

- It seems that Paul is speaking as a born again man and mature in his faith and walk with the Lord
- Do we have two natures?
- In a sense we do but we don't. You are one and whole in Christ but sin is still here and we have to deal with it
- We must know that in position we have many and great promises and truths but we are to learn to live them out in our practice
- We need to learn to do like who we are
- We have no excuse to sin. Victory is ours but the desire to sin is still there
- Don't play the carnal Christian game like an excuse to be saved and live lost!

1. Lessons about the law

a. The law cannot change me or make me holy 14 For we know that the law is spiritual: but \mathbf{I} am carnal, sold under sin.

- The law is good and reveals us the holiness of God. It helps us see our need of a Saviour
- ii. The law is spiritual and deals with our inner man, the spiritual part of us not just our external actions
- iii. The old nature knows no Law, the new nature needs no Law.
- iv. The Law cannot transform the old nature; it can only reveal how sinful that old nature is.
- v. Trying to live under Law will only *activate* the old nature; he will not eradicate it.
- b. The law cannot help me do good 15 For that which I do I allow not: for what I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that do I. 16 If then I do that which I would not, I consent unto the law that it is good. 17 Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. 18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to perform that which is good I find not. 19 For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not,

I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in **me**. 21 I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with **me**. 22 For I delight in the law of God after the inward man:

- i. The problem in this passage is with self, notice the personal pronouns! 27 times the word "I," 7 "me's," 4 "my's" in only 11 verses
- ii. Sin still dwells in us
 - 1. Sold under sin 14 For we know that the law is spiritual: but **I** am carnal, **sold under sin.**
 - 2. There is nothing good in me 18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to perform that which is good I find not.
 - 3. Sin dwells in me 20 Now if \mathbf{I} do that \mathbf{I} would not, it is no more \mathbf{I} that do it, but \mathbf{sin} that dwelleth in \mathbf{me} .

- iii. Though I am saved I will never be anything more than an unprofitable servant Luke 17:10 So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do.
- iv. Something in me always rebels against the law
- v. The law never enables me to do good
- c. The cannot set us free $21 \ \mathbf{I}$ find then a law, that, when \mathbf{I} would do good, evil is present with \mathbf{me} . 22 For \mathbf{I} delight in the law of God after the inward man: 23 But I see another law in **my** members, warring against the law of **my** mind, and bringing **me** into captivity to the law of sin which is in \mathbf{my} members. 24 O wretched man that \mathbf{I} am! who shall deliver **me** from the body of this death? 25 I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.
 - No matter how many times I decide that I will not do wrong I do it again

- ii. I try and try and can't succeed
- iii. The law actually gives strength to sin
 I Corinthians 15:56 The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law.
- d. The flesh can't John 6:63 It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.
 Philippians 3:3 For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.
- e. Victory is found as I learn to yield to the Holy Spirit working in me Philippians 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure.
- f. Legalism makes a believer wretched because it grieves the new nature and aggravates the old nature!
- g. The legalist becomes a Pharisee whose outward actions are acceptable, but whose inward attitudes are despicable.
- 2. The great truths of this passage

- a. Sin dwells in us even though we delight in the law of God
- b. We are powerless against sin in ourselves
- c. I do not really want to sin
- d. The only way to have victory is to yield to Jesus and His working in my life
- 3. Truths that lead to victory
 - a. There is victory in Christ over sin. We can reckon that to be true
 - b. As we yield to the Lord Jesus we will be willing for Him to show us our sin and selfishness
 - c. We will agree with God about our sin and selfishness by His grace
 - d. He will help us to reckon ourselves to really be dead to sin and alive to Him
 - e. We will often struggle with sin James 4:4 Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the **friendship of the world is enmity with God?** whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God. 4:6 But he **giveth more grace.** Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but **giveth grace unto the humble**. 7

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. 8 Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded. 9 Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness. 10 Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.

- f. It is not about more information but about more application
- 4. Take home truths from this passage
 - a. God's people will have a lifetime of struggles against sin
 - i. So be prepared
 - ii. Stay awake and alert
 - iii. Determine to live out who you are
 - iv. Trust the Lord to bring holiness to pass in your life
 - b. We will never have victory in and by ourselves in the Christian life
 - i. There is no quick fix

- ii. There is no list of sins to stop or good deeds to start
- iii. No conference nor revival that will just fix things from here on out
- iv. We decide to walk in faith, loving Jesus, listening to Him, being sensitive to the Holy Spirit
- c. Even in victory we are still unprofitable servants
 - Because we never win the victory
 - ii. We are too prone to think to much of ourselves

 Revelation 4:11 **Thou art worthy**, O Lord, to receive

 glory and honour and power: for **thou hast** created

 all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were

 created.
- d. We have been given tools to fight with and we should use them Ephesians 6:10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. 11 Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. Philippians 3:12 Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ

Jesus. 13 Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, 14 I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. Hebrews 12:1 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, 2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds. 4 Ye have not yet resisted unto blood, striving against sin.

- f. Bible study
- g. Preaching
- h. Christian fellowship

- Service to others
- j. Worship
- k. Accountability
- I. Mature Christians struggle against sin
- m. Mature Christians know that victory is only found in the person and work of Jesus 25 I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.
 - i. Never trust yourself to live the Christian life
 - ii. Never think you have it down
 - iii. Never think you are beyond sin
- n. Though we struggle with sin His grace is sufficient and should motivate us to seek holiness
 - i. His mercies should motivate us Romans 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.
 - 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye **transformed by the renewing of your mind,** that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

- ii. The One we love is coming soon Romans 13:12 The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light.
- iii. He will reward us for our loving service
 - I Corinthians 9:24 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. 25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they *do it* to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. 26 I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: 27 But I keep under my body, and bring *it* into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.
- o. It is Jesus that saved us and is saving us even now
- p. Our victory is just another proof of His grace and triumph over sin Philippians 1:6 Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ: I Corinthians 10:13 There hath no temptation

taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also **make a** way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it.
