What Is Legalism?

- Legalism is the view that man is justified by keeping the law.
- 2. A legalist is someone who behaves as if they can earn God's approval through personal performance.
- Legalism is any system whereby the merits of man contribute in any way to his standing with God.

What Is Legalism?

4. Legalism can effect one's understanding of justification and/or sanctification.

Definition of Sanctification

Sanctification is that continuous operation of the Holy Spirit by which the holy disposition imparted in regeneration is maintained and strengthened.

Matthew 23:23-28

Christ denounced the legalism of the Pharisees for:

- Showcasing their self-righteousness (v. 23a).
- 2. Stressing minor things (vv. 23-24).
- 3. Emphasizing the externals (vv. 25-28).
- Focusing on human tradition instead of the inspired Word (Matthew 15:2-3; Mark 7:8-9).

- 1. Having rules or standards in the home, church, or school.
- 2. Seeking to live a consecrated Christian life.
- 3. Practicing the spiritual disciplines.
- 4. Holding to personal convictions.

- 2. Assuming conformity to rules brings spirituality.
- 3. Making extra-biblical rules as normal standards and requirements for all.
