

## *Abram Returns to Canaan*

### **Genesis 13:1-18**

#### Main Point:

God's people are to walk by faith and not by sight. Knowing that Jesus did this for you, seek to do the same.

1. When you fall into sin, you need to get back on the right path.
2. Being on the right path means you walk by faith.
3. You should walk by faith because walking by sight is perilous.
4. You should walk by faith because it will eventually be replaced with sight.
5. You can walk by faith because Jesus always did.
